FTE AND BENEFITS:

- Current FTE: 1.0 (40 hours/week)

THE POSITION: The Program Supervisor supervises and supports Peer Coordinators and CASA Volunteers to oversee and implement the direct service of the CASA Program. Bilingual preferred.

REQUIRED: A Bachelor's degree is preferred in social work, psychology. A combination of education and work experience in human services may substitute. Must have previous experience working with volunteers and knowledge and understanding of juvenile law, child abuse and neglect, families in crisis, and other social services skills.
