### Who we are


The Oregon CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates)
Network supports local CASA programs across Oregon that speak for the best interests of abused and neglected children experiencing protective custody. The OCN works with local CASA programs to promote and support quality volunteer advocacy to help ensure each child a safe, permanent, and nurturing home.

## Mission

Our mission is to lead Oregon's CASA programs to provide a strong voice for every abused and neglected child statewide. We do this by:

- Promoting awareness of Oregon's CASA programs, CASA volunteers, and children who have experienced abuse or neglect.
- Supporting local program offices (capacitybuilding, training, technical assistance, collaboration, pass-through funding).
- Working with the National CASA/GAL Network to support strategic expansion and development of CASA programs.

### **Financial**

### Adopt the annual budget and ensure that proper financial controls are in place

### **Planning**

Establish and periodically review OCN's goals and objectives.

### **Policy**

Decide and/or approve policy and legislative positions

### Oversight

Select/hire the OCN Director and define the Director's responsibilities.

### Support

Provide professional support to the OCN Director to further the goals of OCN and assess annually the Director's job performance.

### **Ethics**

Ensure legal and ethical integrity and accountability

### Recruit

Strategically recruit and mentor new Board members

### Represent

Represent statewide perspective in deliberations and bring a unique professional perspective to Board deliberations

### **Promote**

Actively promote OCN's purpose and mission through effective communication with the public, the press, legislative members and other elected officials, community partners, and others as appropriate

### Equity

Embrace and promote in all Board matters

Take no private/personal equity, diversity and inclusion action that will compromise the Board or staff. Respect the potential confidentiality of information shared with and by OCN Board members or OCN staff

Understand and agree that OCN Board service requires an average time commitment of between three and ten hours per month




# Apply
