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Typical Local Program

The summary table below describes a "typical" state local program based on data provided by **22 of the 22 local programs** in **Oregon** that responded to the 2021 National CASA/GAL Association Annual Local Program Survey (ALPS). In Oregon, 21 local programs are administrated on a nonprofit basis, and one is administrated by tribal government. Programs served 36 of the state's 36 counties.

Areas Served

• A total of 36 counties were served (range:1-4 counties per program)

Changes in Revenue

• 55% of responding programs reported an increase in revenue in 2021 compared to 2020.

Changes in Number of Children Served

• 9% decrease in the reported number of children served since 2020.

18% of responding programs reported an increase in the number of full-time staff in 2021 compared to 2020; 59% reported fewer full-time staff; 23% reported the same full-time staff.

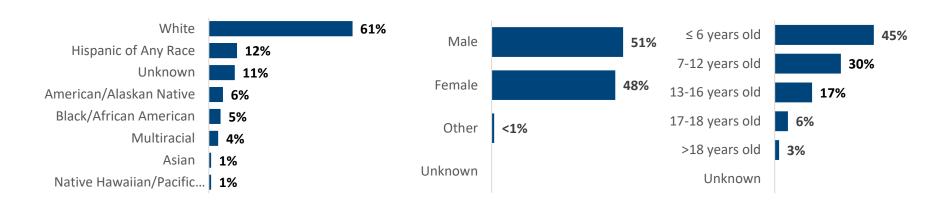

A total of **4,581 children** were served. Children served were **mostly White** (61%) **or Hispanic** (12%), and under the age of 16 (92%), with 45% of children **age 6 and under**. The program served **51% male** and 48% female children.

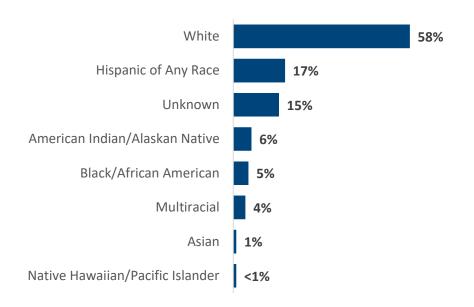

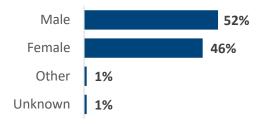
Race, Gender, Age

Race and Gender



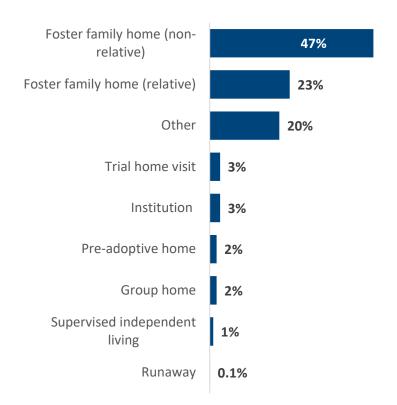


There was a reported total of **1,379 new** children served. Most new children served were White (58%) or Hispanic (17%). Another 15% of those children were of unknown race. New children served were **52% male** and 46% female.

Placement Types

In 2021, there were 3,516 children placed in out-of-home care. Of these children, 23% were placed with a relative and 47% with a non-relative foster parent.

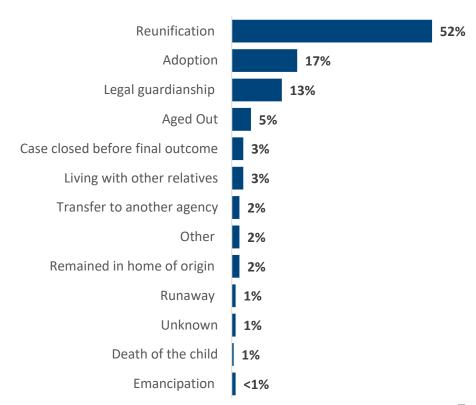
Out-Of-Home Placement Types



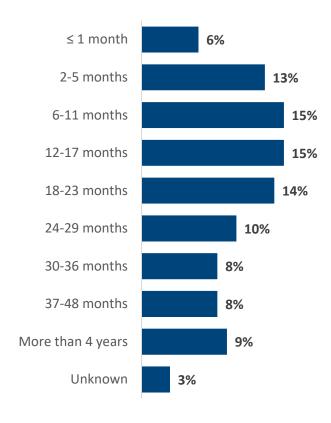
Children involved in closed cases

Forty-four percent of children served whose cases closed spent between 6 and 23 months in out-of-home care, with 30% spending between 6 and 17 months.

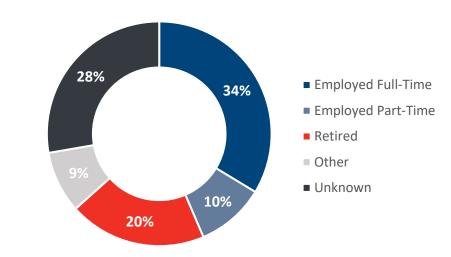

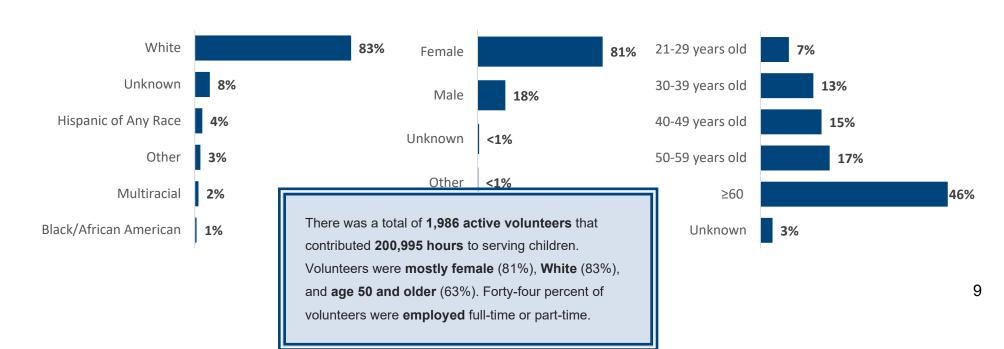

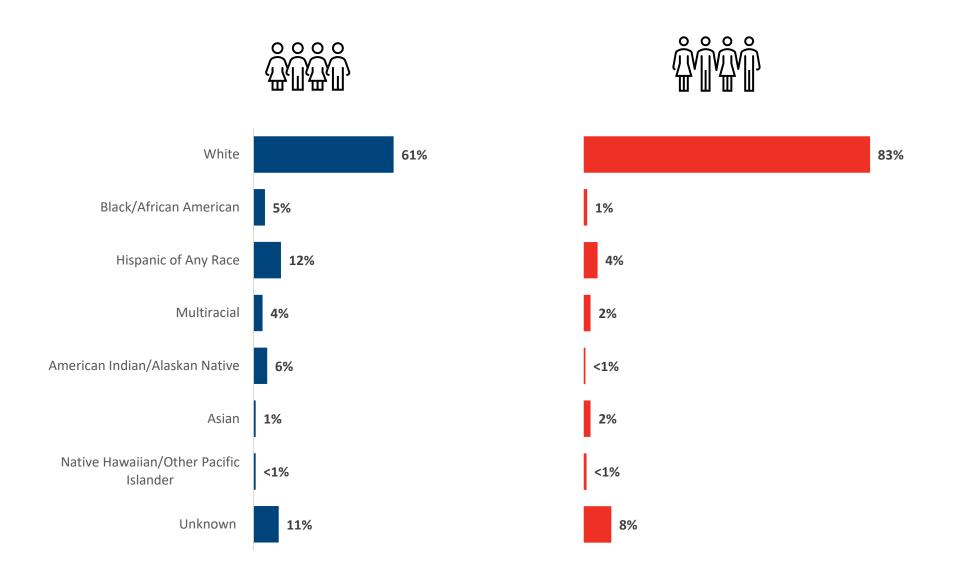


Characteristics of Active/Assigned Volunteers

Race/Ethnicity Comparison between served **Children** and active **Volunteers**



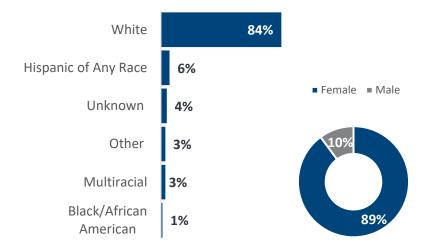

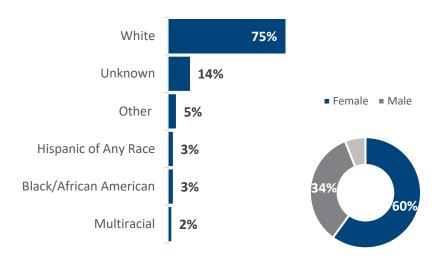
Program Staff Demographics

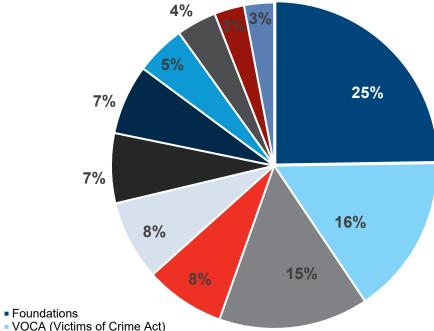

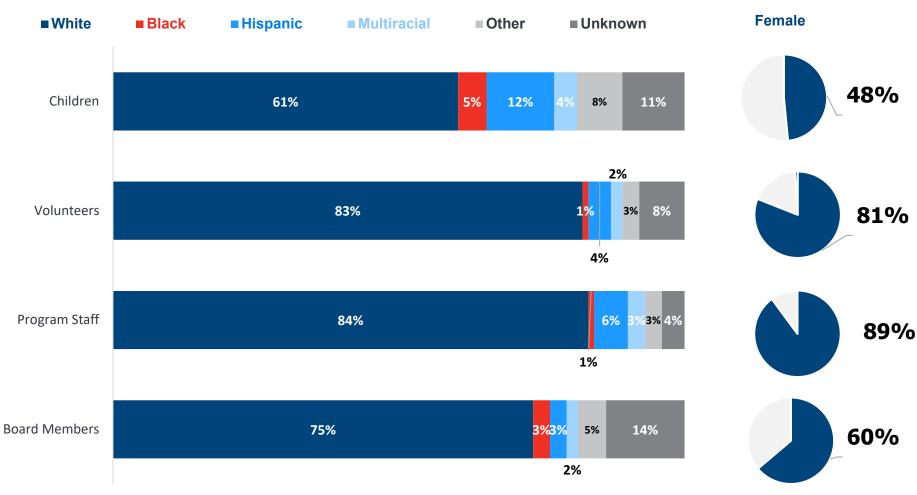
